PLEASE PRINT OR TYPEWRITE on entry form. Club and/or Show Superintendent assume no liability for illegible or wrong information.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS REGARDING CORRECTION OR CHANGES TO ENTRIES. The specific changes listed in Ch 11, Sec 6 (i.e. sex of a dog, transfers between age specific regular classes and "move ups" to BOB or BOV) of the Dog Show Rules are the **only** changes to the entries superintendents or secretaries are authorized to make **after closing of entries. THIS RULE IS STRICTLY ENFORCED BY THE AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB. PLEASE CHECK YOUR ENTRIES CAREFULLY.** Corrections to entries may be made by the Superintendent prior to the closing of entries, if such correction is submitted in writing. Exhibitors are required to report any changes/corrections after closing directly to the American Kennel Club.

CLASSIFICATION

REGULAR CLASSES

- Puppy Dogs, 6 months & under 9 months
- Puppy Dogs, 9 months & under 12 months
- Dogs, 12 months & under 18 months
- Novice Dogs
- Bred-by-Exhibitor Dogs

The Bred-by-Exhibitor Class shall be for dogs that are: a) Six months of age or older as of the first day of the show; b) Not Champions of record on the day of closing of entries for the show; c) Individually registered with the AKC as of the date of closing of entries for the show; d) Owned or co-owned by any of the breeders of record as of the date of the closing of entries for the show. **The person handling the dog is in this class must be a breeder of record and an owner of this dog.** In any subsequent classes for which the dog from the Bred-by-Exhibitor class is eligible, there are no restrictions as to who may handle.

Eligibility: All dogs entered in the Bred-by-Exhibitor Class must be individually registered with the AKC. The person handling the dog must be a breeder of record of the dog and an owner of record of the dog. To exhibit in this class, family members must be a breeder and owner of record.

BEST OF BREED COMPETITION

The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed Competition. Dogs that are Champions of Record and Dogs which according to their owner's records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose champion are unconfirmed. The entry and showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where a dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owner's record. If, at the end of the 90 day period, the championship of a dog has not been confirmed by the American Kennel Club, no further entries of the dog for Best of Breed competition are to be made until its championship has been confirmed by the AKC.

Following Best of Breed judging there will be competition for:
Best Puppy in Puppy Classes - Best Bred-by-Exhibitor - Best Veteran - Best Phalene

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING SINGLE DOG ENTRIES

Winners of these classes are eligible to compete in Best of Breed (Variety) Competition
Veteran Dog Class Veteran Bitch Class

A class for dogs and a class for bitches. The Veteran Classes shall be for any dog or bitch 7 years of age or older. Winners from these classes will be eligible to compete for BEST OF BREED. Neutered dogs and spayed bitches are allowed to compete in Veteran Classes only at independent specialties and/or those all-breed shows which do not offer any competitive classes beyond Best of Breed.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

NOTE: As the judges' decision in these classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in the class will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won any of these classes.

***Stud Dog Class:** For Stud Dogs and at least two but no more than five of their Get. Stud Dogs must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and must be shown in the ring with their Get. The Owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be owner of Get. While the merits of the Stud Dog are not to be considered in the placement of the entry, the Stud Dog must be examined to determine if it has a condition that would require its disqualification or excusal under the Dog Show Rules, AKC Policy, or the standard for its breed. Get must be entered in a Regular Class, Best of Breed Competition, or some other Non-Regular class.

***Brood Bitch Class** will be same as Stud Dog except replace "Stud Dog" with "Brood Bitch" and "Get" with "Produce".

*Chapter 11, Section 8 of the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows" provides that "a castrated male may be entered as a Stud Dog in the Stud Dog Class and a spayed bitch may be entered as a Brood Bitch in the Brood Bitch Class.

Brace Class: For two dogs of the same breed, irrespective of sex, with at least one common owner. Each can be entered individually in a Regular Class, but is not required. An official entry form must be completed for each dog comprising the brace.

Award of Merit - The judge, at his/her discretion, may recall into the ring up to five dogs/bitches to receive an Award of Merit. These awards are reserved for those quality Papillons the judge feels are worthy of final consideration for Best of Breed.

**SPECIAL ATTRACTION
PARADE OF CHAMPIONS AND PERFORMANCE TITLE HOLDERS
Wednesday, April 23, 2008**

Eligibility: Dogs entered in this class may or may not be entered in a Regular class at this show; however, all dogs must be holders of either an American Kennel Club Champion of Record Title and/or American Kennel Club performance event title. The class will not be judged and each entry will receive the special prize of a rosette imprinted with the dog's name. A biography of the dog, up to 200 words MUST be included with the entry form. Entry fee, \$25.00.

NOVICE JUNIOR CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Places with competition present in a Novice Showmanship Class at a licensed or member show.

NOVICE INTERMEDIATE CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Showmanship Class at a licensed or member show.

NOVICE SENIOR CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have not won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Showmanship Class at a licensed or member show.

OPEN JUNIOR CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 9 years old and under 12 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Showmanship Class at a licensed or member show.

OPEN INTERMEDIATE CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 12 years old and under 15 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Showmanship Class at a licensed or member show.

OPEN SENIOR CLASS: For Boys and Girls who are at least 15 years old and under 18 years old on the day of the show and who, at the time entries close, have won three First Places, with competition present, in a Novice Showmanship Class at a licensed or member show.

Competition must exist for Best Junior Handler.

BITCHES IN SEASON ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE.

NOTE: Be sure all information for Junior Showmanship Classes is entered on front and back of the entry form.

By signing the entry form certification is given that the Junior Showman does not now, and will not at any time, act as an agent/handler for pay while continuing to compete in Junior Showmanship.
